How to register your litter of pups

Are you a breeder and ready to get your litter registration off and racing? Here are the steps to follow on eTrac to make sure you're on the right track.

- 1 Complete a whelping notice and litter registration. Return it to GWIC within 14 days of the whelp/due date.
- 2 Submit record of C3 vaccination at 6-8 weeks.
- 3 Submit record of C5 vaccination at 10-16 weeks.
- 4 GWIC will arrange microchipping/ear tattooing of the litter between 12-16 weeks. GWIC completes a litter identification form.
- 5 GWIC registers the litter.



Litters can not be registered until those steps are completed. If you require any assistance contact us on 13 49 42 (13 GWIC).

Part 4: Greyhound breeding

Participants must obtain from a veterinarian a written certification that a greyhound is fit to breed before the greyhound may be registered to breed. A female greyhound must not have been caused or allowed to have more than two litters in any 18-month period.



From the Stewards' box

Betting to lose is an offence under NSW Greyhound Racing Rule LR166A. If a greyhound you train is in a race you must not:

- Place bets on another greyhound in that race
- Have a bet placed on your behalf on another greyhound
- Receive any benefit in any way connected with the laying of your greyhound
