

GREYHOUND WELFARE & INTEGRITY COMMISSION DISCIPLINARY ACTION DECISION

Date of decision: 1 October 2024

Decision-makers: Acting Chief Steward Dean Degan and Steward Paul Van

Name of relevant person: Stephen Gardiner

Rule no(s).: R156(h), R156(w)

Charge(s): Charge 1 – R156(h)

Mr Gardiner did a thing which, in the opinion of the Controlling Body, constitutes an offence, by failing to comply with a lawful

order of a person authorised by the Controlling Body.

Charge 2 - R156(w)

Mr Gardiner did a thing which, in the opinion of the Controlling Body, constitutes an offence, by failing to comply with Clause

9 of the NSW Greyhound Rehoming Policy.

Plea: Charge 1 – Not Guilty

Charge 2 - Guilty

Disciplinary action taken: Charge 1 - To issue a suspension of 4 months.

Charge 2 - To issue a disqualification of 12 months.

With the two penalties to be served concurrently, with the suspension period commencing 1 October 2024, and expiring 1 February 2025, and the disqualification period commencing 1 October 2024 and expiring 1 October 2025.

DECISION:

- 1. Mr Gardiner was, at all relevant times, a registered Public Trainer and Breeder with the Greyhound Welfare and Integrity Commission.
- 2. On 3 June 2024 Mr Gardiner attended the Bathurst office of the Greyhound Welfare and Integrity Commission. On that date he was given a verbal direction by a person authorised by the Controlling Body to arrange for two greyhounds in his care, Movealong Zayne and Movealong Yankee, to undertake a temperament assessment as required by the NSW Greyhound Rehoming Policy. Mr Gardiner failed to comply with this direction.

- On 13 June 2024 Mr Gardiner arranged for the euthanasia of Movealong Zayne and Movealong Yankee. The euthanasia of these greyhounds did not comply with Clause 9 of the NSW Greyhound Rehoming Policy.
- 4. On 11 September 2024 Mr Gardiner was issued with a notice of charge and proposed disciplinary action ("Notice"). The Notice issued two charges against him for breaches of the following Greyhound Racing Rules:

Rule 156(h) Greyhound Racing Rules

An offence is committed if a person (including an official):

(h) disobeys or fails to comply with a lawful order of a Controlling Body, the Stewards, or another person authorized by a Controlling Body with official duties relating to greyhound racing

R156(w), Greyhound Racing Rules

An offence is committed if a person (including an official):

- (w) fails to comply with a policy or code of practice adopted by a Controlling Body
- 5. The Notice invited Mr Gardiner to attend a hearing on 1 October 2024, and to enter a plea and make submissions in relation to the charges and proposed penalties. The penalties decision makers proposed were:

Charge 1 Rule 156(h) – To issue a suspension of 6 months

Charge 2 Rule 156(w) – To issue a disqualification of 24 months

- 6. On Tuesday 1 October 2024 Mr Gardiner attended a hearing held via Microsoft Teams and;
 - Entered a plea of Not Guilty to Charge 1;
 - Entered a plea of Guilty to Charge 2; and
 - Provided verbal and written submissions
- 7. Following consideration of Mr Gardiner's pleas and submissions, the decision-makers found the charges proven and determined to impose the following disciplinary action upon him:

Charge 1 Rule 156(h) - To issue a suspension of 4 months

Charge 2 Rule 156(w) - To issue a disqualification of 12 months

With the two penalties to be served concurrently, with the suspension period commencing 1 October 2024, and expiring 1 February 2025, and the disqualification period commencing 1 October 2024 and expiring 1 October 2025.

- 8. In taking this disciplinary action, the decision-makers considered all evidence, including:
 - Mr Gardiner's pleas of Guilty to Charge 1 and Not Guilty to Charge 2;
 - Mr Gardiner's 42-year registration history, with no prior penalties for any like offences; and
 - Principles of specific and general deterrence and what message is sent to the industry in respect to such conduct.
