- Use specialised dog nail clippers
- Trim nails in a well lit area
- Trim small amounts at a time
- Regularly monitor growth rates
- Use file to remove sharp edges after trimming

## Code of Practice

### Part 3: Health and wellbeing

When a greyhound is sold, rehomed or otherwise transferred to a different person, the participant transferring the greyhound must supply the greyhound's treatment record to the new custodian.



## From the Stewards' box

An associate attendant registration is for a person between 14 and 18 years of age who is responsible for handling a greyhound, either at a race, a trial or on a property where greyhounds are kept.



Associate attendants **CAN**

When under the direct supervision of a registered adult attendant:

- Handle greyhounds
- Act as a catcher
- Box a greyhound once approved



Associate attendants **CAN'T**

- Box greyhounds until assessed and approved
- Own a greyhound
- Train a greyhound
- Trial a greyhound
- Breed greyhounds
