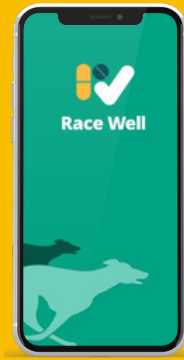

Not sure? Race Well can help you

Meloxicam is an anti-inflammatory drug sold under various brand names and is classed as a Prohibited Substance. While products containing Meloxicam can be used in the regular care and training of greyhounds, it is essential that it is no longer in a greyhound's system on race day. Not sure if a medication contains Meloxicam? Use the free Race Well substance validator smartphone app to check.

Tick the check box

- Paralysis tick numbers spike during wet and hot weather, so it is important to regularly check your greyhounds.
- Don't forget to look inside the ears, under the lips and between your greyhound's toes.
- To remove ticks use fine-pointed tweezers, grasp the tick as close to your greyhound's skin as possible and pull straight up. Don't twist or jerk the tick.

Transfers are as easy as one, two, three

If you have purchased or acquired a new greyhound, it is important to remember you also need to log in to and accept an ownership transfer. This involves three easy steps:

Step 1

Click on Applications and Fines

Step 2

Select Inbound Transfers

Step 3

Accept any transfer notifications

This needs to be done within 10 days of being submitted by the previous owner

Part 9: Rehoming Greyhounds as Companion Animals

Greyhounds must be desexed prior to being rehomed as a companion animal.

Participants must not transfer a greyhound to a person who is under the age of 18 years.

From the Stewards' box

A greyhound scratched from an Event due to injury or illness is given a stand-down period commencing at the time of the scratching and continuing for 10 days from the date of the Event.
