

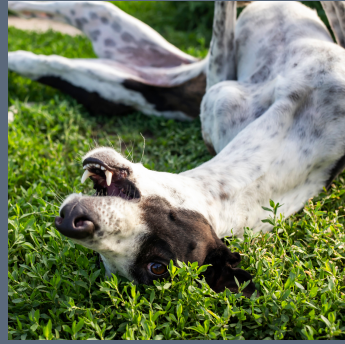

HOW TO... Rehome your greyhound

Greyhound owners are required to rehome any greyhounds they cannot keep themselves.

Greyhounds can be rehomed to other participants, members of the public or to rehoming organisations such as Greyhounds As Pets (GAP).

Greyhounds must be desexed before they can be rehomed and owner must complete a 'Retirement Notification' form and return it to GWIC. For more information visit www.gwic.nsw.gov.au/rehoming

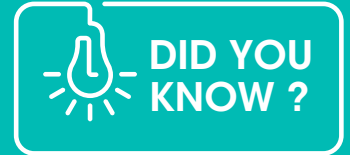

Socialisation in greyhounds refers to a positive interaction with anything they may encounter in racing or later on as a pet, including new people, places, dogs, and other animals.

Early education and socialisation in young greyhounds reduces fearfulness and helps to develop a confident and adaptable greyhound, improving their chances of success in both a racing and home setting.
