## HOW TO.... **get a Junior Attendant Permit**

A junior attendant permit allows a 12- or 13-year-old person to catch greyhounds following a trial on trial days only at a registered greyhound or trial track.

Junior attendants must be directly supervised by an adult who holds a current registration with the Commission.

To apply for a Junior Attendant Permit:

## C5 Vaccination Requirements



**From 1 October 2023 greyhounds will be required to be vaccinated up to C5 level to race in NSW.**

This requirement is in line with the update Greyhound Racing Rules which were released on 1 May 2022.

To comply, provide proof of C5 vaccination to GWIC by 1 September 2023, to allow time for processing.



The eTrac Participant Portal is currently undergoing testing with a number of industry participants.

## CODE OF PRACTICE Cleaning and Food Storage



Part Two of the Greyhound Welfare Code of Practice requires trainers to ensure food containers and food preparation areas are kept clean, and food is stored in a way that prevents spoilage or contamination.



## From the Stewards' Box



A reminder that greyhounds who are required to complete a clearance trial for fail to pursue, blinkers, unsatisfactory performance or marring, must do so with at least two other greyhounds.

If there are no other greyhounds booked to complete a trial at the same time, the trainer is responsible for sourcing the other greyhounds to participate in the trial.
